

A Dedication Service for the Afghanistan/Iraq plaque, to be placed on the cenotaph, will be held in conjunction with our Remembrance Day service at the

cenotaph on 11 November 2022, commencing at 10.45am. This plaque will honour all who served in both the Afghanistan and Iraq wars and made the supreme sacrifice.

The Committee has been investigating the suitability of two new bench seats to be located at the cenotaph, and requested quotations for two different seating types which will complete the DVA Grant which was provided for both the plaque and seats.

The Anzac centenary memorial plaque for Porters Creek Public School is on order and I am advised that it will be in place at the school prior to Remembrance Day. The Committee is planning on having a Dedication Service at the school, in conjunction with a Remembrance Day Service.

The fading signage at Diggers' Inn has now been replaced with new, more visible signage, thanks to Committeeman Bob Swift, who organised both the sign and its installation. Bob is also arranging for the provision of lighting inside the sign. This will act as an additional deterrent to vandalism. Below is a photo of the new signage.



The plaques which were inadvertently replaced into the incorrect positions at the cenotaph will be put back into their original positions, at no cost to the Sub Branch. Central Coast Memorials has advised that they have, to date, partially completed the work.

The following letter was donated to the Sub-branch recently.

A letter from the Western Front WW1 dated 6th January 1918.

A letter from a Digger to his Uncle back in Australia

I am in receipt of your letter dated 6th Nov informing me of Robinson's visit, and giving me all the news, and how your color music is advancing. I am sorry to tell you that the prismatic compass has nothing to do with colour, and is merely a name. The understanding is very easy, it is merely an improved form of compass to ensure accuracy in finding your bearing any given direction N. S. E. or W.

The past two months I have been out of the Scouts and merely doing my bit in the line. In fact very little scouting was necessary.

With you I am certain that Germany's ultimate defeat is certain, in spite of the pendulum's back-ward swing in Italy & Russia and the latest news seems to bear that idea out, as Russia is again gathering strength and Italy seems to be again holding her own while Germany must be looking with apprehension to America's Spring offensive.

I can see the bully turning down her Allies in the near future, and the Terrible Turk will yet rue her alliance. Looking at the price we pay for any advance we make it is hard to believe we are on the winning side.

Many individual soldiers believe our ultimate victory, absolutely uncertain as the price of our advance is so expensive, forgetting the price to Germany is much dearer, while we have the World's reserves at our back.

All this peace talk is sure to have some actual feeling for the same, the game being to bluff the other fellow.

We have been thru the Fromelles and Paschendale advances and the carnage is awful while the artillery barrages is terrific.

In our advance on Paschendale we suffered terribly, four of my section being killed. Pearson, Sparrow, Simpson and many old chums.

It is nights like these when one thinks the price altogether too heavy for the object won, especially when, even now we can't see the result, and so many good men seemingly gone for nothing, and it is still going on.

The dead and dying everywhere, the earth shell-torn, like a moon cratered surface and all for the greed of gold. The Allies talking of giving back willy-nilly Alsace to France, and at the same time preaching democracy. From a soldier who has travelled there, he tells me Alsace is purely German in its Sympathies. Why create future dispeace by enforcing rule on the people which they do not desire.

I do hope a plebiscite will be put to that state instead of putting an undesirable rule on them.

If we stand for democracy then uphold its principles, and not make the peoples sacrifice a future mockery.

These are my views, if rather imperfectly put, Autocracy is proved no good, then why apply them in the name of democracy.

Forgive this somewhat rambling letter, we like all at home are looking forward to an early & suitable peace brought about on mutual understanding amongst the nations and the sooner the better. We at present are billeted in an agricultural district some distance behind the line with the promise of prolonged rest and I can assure you not before time as we have had it very strenuous of late.

The weather is clear, cold and frosty and all well but feeling the severity of the weather.

A good walk before turning in is the only way of getting up heat.

You will already know Willie has been missing since 25th August, no hope being held out as to his turning up. I had a letter from home today and they are all well, but they are having an anxious time of it with Peter also being away fighting.

Now I will draw to a close. Give my love to Aunt Nell, Margaret and the boys and hoping you are all well and wishing you a Happy New Year.
