Welcome to this my second report as President of Toukley RSL Sub-branch.

Firstly I should thank my Vice President Mike Humphries for sitting in the chair to run the March General Meeting while I was on holidays.

We have received a reply from Karen McNamara indicating that she is willing to continue as Patron of the Sub-branch. This is very welcome news.

Anzac Day preparations have been taking up most of our time and we still have a lot of work to do to ensure the day is a success. The sub-committee formed to

take care of this process have been doing a good job and at this stage I am confident we are on the right track for a good outcome on the day.

At the time of writing this report there are 10 schools, 9 Aged Care facilities and 1 Pre school booked in for an Anzac Day service. The services will start on 29 March so by the time you read this report one of the services at a school will have already been completed and the remainder will be completed by 1 May. Obviously also there are the two Services to be held at the Cenotaph on Anzac Day so the total of services conducted will be 22.

The committee has been looking at ways to accommodate our members who may wish to participate in the march but think it may be beyond them physically. One thought is to include the bus in the march with these members in the bus. The bus will leave the front of the club at 9.15 am to drive to the Village Green and if there are sufficient numbers the bus will be in the parade just behind the jeep.

Tickets for the Anzac Day luncheon for members and partners will again be available for purchase at the April 2023 General Meeting from Mike Humphries. Ticket sales have been a bit slow so please purchase your tickets from Mike so that we can organise the seating on the day.

The Annual Anzac Day Service is again being held at the Wallarah Bay Recreation Club on Sunday 16 April starting at 9.00 am.

Toukley RSL Sub-branch has always supported this event and the Committee feels this should continue this year. We need a flag party so if anyone is available please let Tommy Hobbs know that you are willing to be in the flag party. The bus leaves the club at 8.00 am. A light meal and refreshments are served after the service and the bus will drop you back at the club after the lunch.

I attended an afternoon tea representing the Sub-branch on Sunday 19 March following the AGM of the National Servicemens' Association Central Coast Subbranch Toukley. This was held to celebrate the 26th anniversary of the formation of the Association. It was good to see and talk to an old friend of the Sub-branch Edna Luckie who continues to support the Nasho's.

On Tuesday 28 March I had a meeting with Sue Allen – the Deputy State Coordinator of RSL NSW Auxiliaries. Sue is one of our nine auxiliary ladies that are now members of Toukley RSL Sub-branch. Member Profile: Michael Humphries

Michael was born on the 4th August 1950 at Bondi N.S.W.

Michael's family moved to Katoomba N.S.W soon after due to his father's employment as a store manager.

The family then moved to Seven Hills N.S.W. after his father was transferred and Michael attended Seven Hills West Primary School.

Michael's secondary schooling was at The Marist Brothers College at Parramatta N.S.W.

In February 1968 Michael joined the Royal Australian Navy and commenced his Ordinary Seaman Training at H.M.A.S. Cerberus in Westernport, Victoria.

Michael had training at H.M.A.S. Watson and also spent 11 months on H.M.A.S. ANZAC training and was then back to H.M.A.S. Cerberus for training doing a Writer's Course.

Michael was drafted in 1969 to H.M.A.S. Nirimba from there completed a computer course at H.M.A.S. Harman. In 1971 he joined H.M.A.S. Sydney where Michael did 4 trips to Vietnam. During H.M.A.S. Sydney 's involvement she carried 16.000 Army and R.A.A.F. personnel to Vung Tau on 24 ferry runs and had made a 25th trip to Vietnam to deliver and pick-up military equipment in 1972. HMAS Sydney gained the nick name the Vung Tau Ferry. After HMAS Sydney he served at HMAS Albatross before his discharge from the R.A.N on 23rd July, 1972.

On the 4th September, 1971 Michael married his childhood sweetheart Denise at the Toongabbie Catholic Church. They met when Michael was 13 and Denise was 12 after Michael's sister Glenda asked if she could bring a friend to his birthday party.

They settled in Prospect and Bossley Park to raise their children, Colin and Natalie and have 3 Grandchildren.

Michael worked for Australian Posters for 35 years which is now known as JC Decaux, doing outdoor posters and billboards and was self employed for 6 years doing Signs and Graphics.

Michael joined the N.S.W.R.S.L. on the 20th September 2011 when a member of the Sub Branch at Smithfield NSW.

Michael and Denise moved to Hamlyn Terrace in 2019.

Michael and Denise both enjoy travelling with Patong Beach in Thailand and the U.S.A. as their favorite destinations.

Denise is on the committee at Our Lady of Mercy College at Parramatta and enjoys gardening, tennis and enjoys watching serials on Netflix and follows Parramatta Eels in the N.R.L.

Michael is Vice President of the Toukley R.S.L. Sub Branch and also an active member of the Vietnam Veterans Association.

Member Profile: Margaret (Molly) Whittle

100 years young

Molly was born in India on 2 April 1923 where her father was serving in the British Army. He was a private in the Royal Welsh Fusiliers. She lived in India until the age of 4 when her father was transferred to Germany. She spent 3.5 years in Germany before the family then returned to England. Molly was 8 years old by this time.

She left school at 16 and worked in a Chemist shop (Boot's) until joining the Woman's Royal Airforce at 19 years of age in 1942.

In the WRAF she was employed as an Ambulance driver at which time many air raids were concentrated on London. She stayed with the Medical Corps for the remainder

of the war and was de-mobbed in 1947.



Molly remembers driving around London while the V2 rockets (Doodlebugs) were falling. In fact she was hit in the face by shrapnel from one that fell in the area where she was driving. She spent a couple of weeks hospitalized.

She has many memories of living in London during the war – many of them happy but some not so.

She married Patrick in 1954 and they migrated to Australia in 1955. She was had many hobbies of which golf was one of her favourites.

Her favourite TV show these days is 'The Chaser'.

She celebrated her 100th birthday with friends from Wyong Lions Club at Wallarah Bay Club on Sunday 2 April 2023.

She is in the process of selling her duplex and moving into Arcare Nursing home at Kanwal.


