Toukley RSL Sub Branch President's Report:



Welcome to my first report as President of Toukley RSL Sub-branch. I feel honoured to have been given an opportunity to carry out this role and can assure everybody that I and my committee will be doing our best to try and ensure that Toukley RSL Sub-branch continues the good work that has been done by previous committees under the outstanding leadership of Bob Wilson. We are under no illusions of the enormity of the task in front of us but rest assured we will not die lightly. Actually I hope we don't die at all.

We have two new committeemen in Alan Thiele and Chris Doyle and a new Vice-President in Mike Humphries and a new Treasurer in Terry Murray. Already all four have come forward at our first committee meeting on Monday and expressed a willingness to get involved right from the start. This is very heartening to me as I try and settle into my role.

A letter has been sent to our current Patron to see if she is willing to remain in the position and we await her response.

Anzac Day is fast approaching and a Sub-committee has been established to ensure the day remains as good as it has always been. This task has been made easier by the amount of work already done by the outgoing President and the Sub-committee are more than appreciative of his sterling efforts.

At the time of writing this report there are 8 schools, 9 Aged Care facilities and 1 Preschool booked in for an Anzac Day service. There are still two Primary Schools to be followed up but this should be finalised by the time you read this report. The services will start on 29 March and conclude on 1 May. Obviously also there are the two Services to be held at the Cenotaph on Anzac Day so the total of services conducted will be 22.

Tickets for the Anzac Day luncheon for members and partners will be available for purchase at the March 2023 General Meeting from Tommy Hobbs.

The Annual Anzac Day Service is again being held at the Wallarah Bay Recreation Club on Sunday 16 April starting at 9.00 am. Toukley RSL Sub-branch has always supported this event and the Committee feels this should continue this year. We need a flag party so if anyone is available please let Tommy Hobbs know that you are willing to be in the flag party. The bus leaves the club at 8.00 am. A light meal and refreshments are served after the service and the bus will drop you back at the club after the lunch.

All of our efforts at this stage are concentrated on the Anzac Day services but there are other projects that we will be working on later in the year that we will keep all members appraised of.

On 9 November 2023, the Toukley RSL Sub Branch will celebrate 75 years in operation. This is a fabulous milestone and the committee has already had some discussions about holding a commemoration dinner. A tentative booking has already been made with the Ary for Sunday 5 November. More information on this to follow in coming months.

It is now fifty years since our involvement in the Vietnam War ended. The last Australian troops left Vietnam in December 1972 and Australia's war officially ended on 11 January 1973. This year, the Australian Government will mark the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War, culminating with a National Commemorative Service in Canberra on 18 August 2023 and the committee plan to work with our Vietnam Vets to ensure the day is commemorated appropriately.

Another project that will be undertaken when time permits is an upgrade to the memorabilia cupboards inside The Ary. Some of our committee members have noticed these cabinets in other clubs and our displays do not compare and we intend to do something to rectify this.

That concludes my report other than to say that I am unfortunately not available for the March General Meeting but the very capable Mike Humphries will move into the chair to run the meeting.


Roland Gloss 50 Year Service Certificate


