What a wonderful turnout again this year for our march and Anzac Day Commemoration Services at the Cenotaph!

Our Schools and Aged Care Anzac Services commenced on 29 March 2023 and will conclude on 1 May 2023. Thank you to the Committee who, between them, attended ten schools, eight Aged Care Facilities, one pre school, Wallarah Bay Recreation Club plus the Dawn and Morning Services at the cenotaph on Anzac Day.

The Dawn Service attracted a huge crowd in attendance at our very moving Dawn Service. We were lucky with the weather this year and were very pleased to see a starry sky when we arrived at the Cenotaph at 4.00 am to begin setting up for the day. It is hard to gauge the number of residents who turned up to pay their respects to our Anzacs but it is the biggest crowd that I have seen. Huge crowds also again turned out for the well-attended march from the Village Green to the cenotaph and Morning service.

We are very grateful to have the ongoing support of 381 Squadron RAAF Williamtown and the attendance of 24 servicemen and women on the day. The 236 Army Cadets did themselves proud in assisting as catafalque party and flag party respectively at both services. The 236 Army Cadets also had a presence in the march and carried the National Servicemen Association banner in the march. The newly formed Australian Cadet Corps marched and have committed to having a band for the march next year.

Thanks should also go to the Wallarah Bay Community Band, the Toukley RSL Pipes and Drums, the Warnervale Public School Choir and Brassick for their continued support and their performances at the two services.

The members' breakfast was very well attended and the luncheon had 104 Sub Branch members, partners and invited guests. The bacon and egg roll, provided by the Sub Branch, to the general public who attended the Dawn Service was also very popular.

I am very pleased with the outcome of the day, the most important day on the Sub Branch calendar. The performance of "Spirit of the Anzacs" by Brassick at the Dawn Service and "Lest We Forget" by the Warnervale Public School choir were outstanding. The Sub Branch has received a lot of positive feedback on the day which is very pleasing.

The Memorial Gardens looked a picture for this important day and we thank The Ary for ensuring that it looked at its absolute best.

I also need to thank my dedicated and hard working committee who have put in long hours for the last couple of months to ensure that all the services were carried out to the best of their ability. Veterans Connect is a pilot program that is being trialled on the Central Coast. Their goal is to help veterans and their families find DVA friendly medical and health services across the coast.

An example of how you would use them would be: Your physiotherapist moved away and you needed a new physiotherapist that could take either white or gold card. You can contact Veterans Connect and they will help find one in your area that meets your requirements.

They can provide the following support option:

- · Connection to or information about health and specialist clinical providers
- Connection with social and community services

 - Dealing with practicalities such as finding transport to appointments.

VE DAY 8TH May 1945

Victory in Europe Day is the day celebrating the formal acceptance by the Allies of World War II of Germany's unconditional surrender of its armed forces on Tuesday, 8 May 1945, marking the official end of World War II in Europe on the Eastern Front, with the last shots fired on the 11th. Russia and some former Soviet countries celebrate on 9 May.

Several countries observe public holidays on the day each year, also called Victory Over Fascism Day, Liberation Day or Victory Day. In the UK it is often abbreviated to **VE Day**, or **V-E Day** in the US, a term which existed as early as September 1944, in anticipation of victory.

The end of all combat actions was specified as 23:01 Central European Time, which was already 9 May in eastern Europe, and thus several former Soviet bloc countries—including Russia and Belarus, as well as some former Yugoslav countries like Serbia—celebrate Victory Day on 9 May.




