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### ***Toukley RSL Sub Branch President's Report:***



For my report this month I will plagiarise the report I presented to the AGM.

It has been a challenging 12 months with three new executive members and two new committee men elected at the AGM last year. We also had one new Trustee come on board at the AGM then following the resignation of one of the trustees in May we then had another new Trustee elected in June. We also sadly lost our Honourary Treasurer in May so were left without financial advice until a local accounting firm was appointed in July.

As always our main aim as a committee is to ensure the Commemorative events that we are responsible for are held at a high standard. Our two services on

ANZAC Day attracted record crowds and we only received positive feedback which was an indicator of the amount of work that the committee had put in.

2023 also saw a greater emphasis on Vietnam Veterans Day as it was the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the withdrawal of troops from Vietnam. Again a lot of work went in to ensure the success of this day.

Remembrance Day was another Commemorative event and as it fell on a Saturday the crowd was bigger than usual and the Service was well received.

2023 also saw the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the sub-Branch. The committee, and especially the Secretary spent a lot of time to ensure this occasion was appropriately celebrated.

The committee also worked to ensure that our two centenarian members celebrated their parties appropriately.

2023 also saw the re-emergence of the Auxiliary in a fundraising capacity. Funds were raised for the sub-Branch in the leadup to ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day.

The Welfare section continue to provide support to our members who are not in good health with visits and phone calls.

The Transport Manager continues to monitor the use of the bus and reports back to the Committee each month on usage etc.

Bob Swift continues to put in the time to organise the monthly bus trips. The members that take advantage of these trips are appreciative of his efforts.

I would like to thank my executive members and committee members for their support throughout the year. Without their assistance things would not have gone as smoothly as they appeared to be. Four of the committee spent some time in hospital at various stages of the year – putting more pressure on the other members of the committee.

I also have to report that two members of the committee have resigned in the last month – Chris Doyle and Tommy Hobbs.

That means that there are two vacancies on the Committee.

Jenny Leach has also stood down as co-ordinator of the Auxiliary group and they are having a meeting to elect a new co-ordinator on 6 March.

ANZAC Day preparations are progressing well. All the school services and Aged Care Facility services have been booked in – starting on 8 April and ending on 2 May.

The sub-Branch will again be supporting the ANZAC Day service at Wallarah Bay on Sunday 8 April. We are again looking for members to be in the Flag Party. The bus will leave The Ary at 8.00 am.

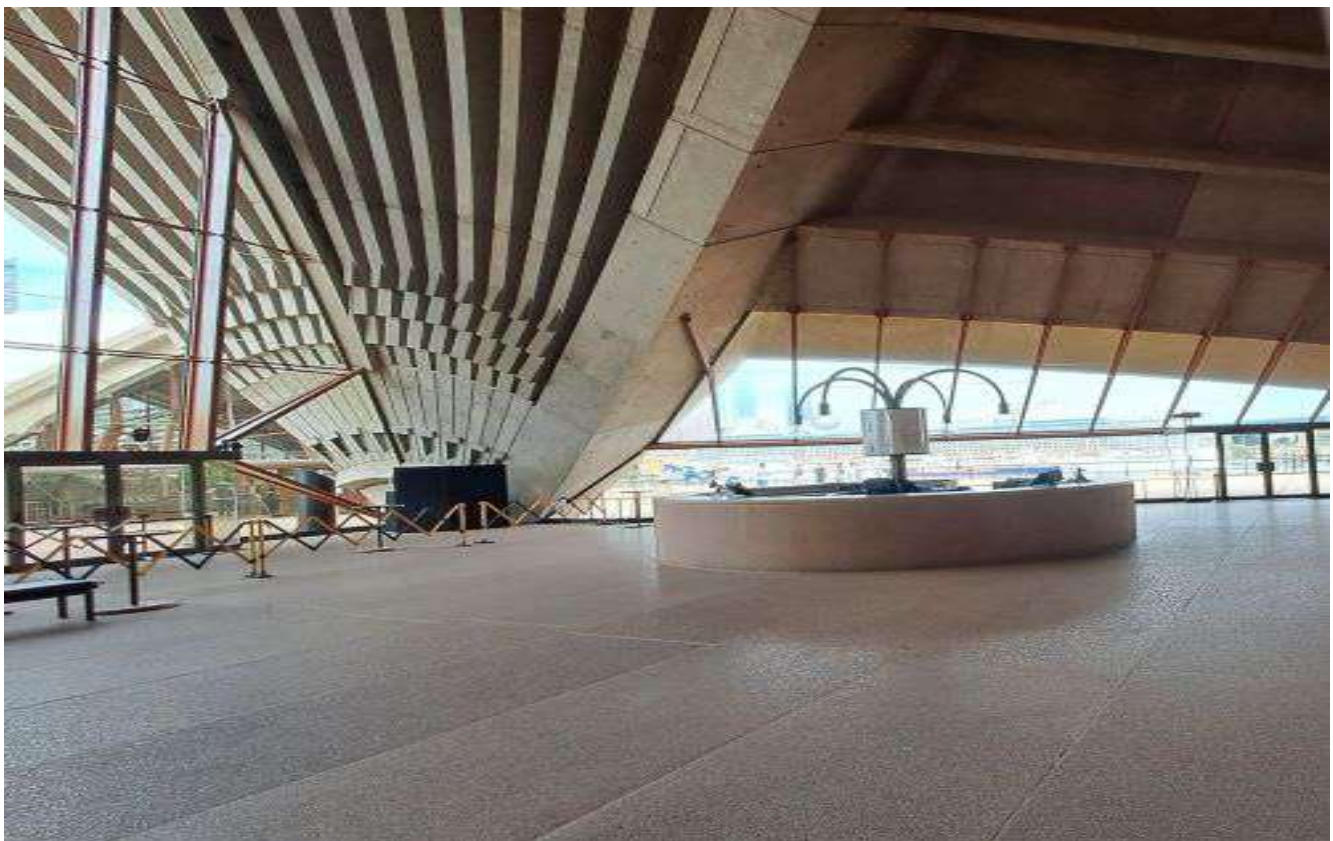
