

What a wonderful turnout this year for our March and Anzac Day Commemoration Services at the cenotaph!

Our Schools and Aged Care Anzac Services commenced on 5 April 2024 and concluded on 2 May 2024. Thank you to the Committee who, between them, attended eleven Commemoration services at ten schools, nine Aged Care Facilities, one Retirement home, one pre-school, the Wallarah Bay Recreation Club Commemoration service, the Greek Orthodox Church Commemoration service plus the Dawn and Morning Services at the cenotaph on Anzac Day. Thanks also to Trustee Max Thom, member Brian Murphy and Auxiliary ladies Denise Humphries and Christine Sellers who assisted at various times.

The coolish weather did not deter the huge crowd in attendance at our very moving Dawn Service to pay their respects to our Anzacs. The inclusion of Brassick Duo in the service I feel adds to the solemnity of the occasion and the sub-Branch thanks them for their continued involvement. Huge crowds also again turned out for the well-attended march from the Village Green to the cenotaph and Morning service. This year we picked up another school in Lakes Grammar for the March giving us 10 schools in all who join the march. Another plus for the march this year was the availability of two bands to march. The sub-Branch would like to thank the Toukley RSL Pipes and Drums for marching this year and also the Australian Cadet Corps Band who joined us for the first time this year.

We are very grateful to have the ongoing support of 381 Squadron RAAF Williamtown and the attendance of 22 servicemen and women on the day. The 236 Army Cadets and Australian Cadet Corps did themselves proud in assisting as catafalque party and flag party respectively at both services.

We are also very pleased to have the support of The Ary and I thank the CEO, the Board and all the staff for their efforts in ensuring the success of the day.

The members' breakfast was very well attended and the luncheon was well attended by Sub Branch members, partners and invited guests. The bacon and egg roll, provided by the Sub Branch, to the general public who attended the Dawn Service was also very popular.

We know that people travelled from afar to attend our Anzac Services, including Sydney, and we thank you all for your support. All in all, I am very pleased with the outcome of the day, the most important day on the sub-Branch calendar. The performance of "I am Australian/Anzac Version" by Brassick Duo at the Dawn Service and "Lest We Forget" by the Warnervale Public School choir were outstanding.
