

Toukley RSL Sub-Branch President's Report:



The month started for the Committee with Mike and Denise Humphries and I attending the matinee session of the Warnervale Primary School concert on 8 August. This was an enjoyable afternoon with all the primary school kids showcasing their talents. Warnervale Primary school continue to support the sub-Branch each Anzac Day so it is important for us to support them as well.

On the same day a funeral was held for our oldest member Molly Whittle at Palmdale. Judith Walker, Bob Swift and Tommy Hobbs represented the sub-Branch at the service.

On 9 August I had a meeting at Doyalson with Bob Dokter to plan our approach to the CCDC meeting on the following Monday re RSL NSW move in blocking the funding to the CCVC.

Mike Humphries and I attended the CCDC meeting on Monday 12 August where we had the chance to put forward our displeasure at the treatment of the CCVC. Doyalson and The Entrance/Long Jetty also joined us in this. A motion was moved and approved that the CCDC asked RSL NSW to reverse its decision on the CCVC. At this stage nothing has been heard on it.

Four members of the Committee and I performed an RSL tribute service at the Funeral of one of our members Ralph Bull at Palmdale on Thursday 15 August. The family and friends were appreciative of the service.

Vietnam Veterans Day on 18 August was reasonably well attended. It was good to see the Veterans MC Central Coast in attendance in numbers supporting our Commemorative service.

The repair to the rear wall at Diggers Inn was completed. All the damaged mortar was repaired and the bricks were coated with a water repellent

substance then two layers of acrylic paint were applied. I have applied for a grant from The Mounties Community Grants scheme to cover the cost of the work. The grant applications close on 31 August so we should find out next month if we have been successful.

I also had a half-day training session with Iva Prentice from our Accountants on the software they use for our accounts Xero Software.

Rob Sellers went to the Saltwater Sailors afternoon at Gosford on 20 August. Rob said he enjoyed the afternoon. If you want to know what it was like have a chat to Rob.

Friday 23 August saw a bus trip to a Pearl Farm at Moonee Moonee – see report later in magazine.

On that note I have to report that Bob Swift has handed in his resignation from the Committee effective 31 August. I would like to take this opportunity to, on behalf of all members of the sub-Branch, thank Bob for his great contribution to Toukley RSL sub-Branch. To give some indication as to the amount of time and effort Bob has contributed over the years I have had to allocate tasks to three different people to cover what Bob has been doing over the years. Steve Edmunds will be taking over the Managing role at Diggers, Christine Sellers and the Auxiliary have taken over organising the bus trips and Judith Walker has taken over the supervision of the Cenotaph and Cenotaph Gardens.
